

2 Broadheads were found in the targets. Broadheads are strictly forbidden on the indoor range. They tear up the targets and are a hazard when we work on the bales.

The fabric for the bales is expensive and hard to find as the original manufacturer has discontinued this target. We have to find aftermarket sources then have the fabric sewn to fit the fronts and backs. The club spent around \$3000 on this repair.

Please treat the targets as the shared resource they are!

Indoor Target Bales



The indoor target bales have a front and back section. Both have a tubular metal frame with fabric cover. The fabric is sewn to form a case, then slipped over the frame. The front section is unpacked and we place sheet cardboard on the fronts for smooth face to mount targets. The fabric on the front and rear will hold arrows at the angle of entry—that's straight for most of us, most of the time. The fabric is a heavy synthetic material, but does wear out over time, especially the centers. Shooting off center will help to extend the life of the fronts.

Large sheets of thick cardboard can be hard to find. Thanks to Jeremiah Zeien for bringing out the stack we have now!

The target back section is similar to the front but is several inched thicker and is stuffed with fabric. This is an effective arrow stop. Like the front, centers also get shot out over time. Shooting off center will help here too.





Fronts and backs are bracketed together then placed on the rolling frames. These targets are top heavy, and will tip if pulled from the front/back. Best to pull orpush from the sides then realign once in position.
