The Aiming for a Cure shoot is going on this weekend. Weather is not cooperating and turnout is light.



WORK BY MEMBERS AT THE WALTONIAN ARCHERS CLUB

When you joined the Waltonian Archers you agreed to accept the responsibility to help work and maintain our organization.

Our organization has many jobs including cleaning and mowing of our many ranges and targets. We have 70 plus targets, as well as the gate area and flats that require weekly mowing. The pavilion area also requires mowing, sweeping and pick up each week. Our ranges are the backbone of the club. Mowing and trimming of the grounds is essential. The WALC is a premium among the many clubs in the State of lowa. Our ranges provide us with the opportunity to be self-sufficient. We do not get any funds from outside sources. We are able to maintain our grounds by the many events we sponsor, the dues we collect, and donations from club individuals.

The events we sponsor consist of archery shoots either indoor or outdoor. The events may be shooting with a bow and arrow, shooting 3D animals or shooting multiple target styles and every event requires a lot of preparation. We host local level, state level and at times district level events. As a member you are expected to assist in all levels of preparation.

As a club we have available many pieces of mechanical equipment such as hand tools, riding mowers for mowing larger pieces of the ground like the gate area, flats and pavilion, larger pieces are available to maintain the roads and other needed areas. Only thru participation of all individuals can we do the entire job. All working together makes a strong team... Remembering, there is no I in TEAM.

All of the events require many hours of preparation. Preparation means mowing, trimming, Placement of the targets and animals on the ranges as well as the planning and registration for the event. Events held indoors require repair of the backstops and bales and lighting and cleaning of the facility and floors.

The Waltonian Archers of Linn County have a reputation of being a QUALITY organization holding QUALITY events. We can only maintain our reputation by our members sharing in the labor to accomplish our goal.

The Waltonians have a beautiful indoor range with a large kitchen attached. The indoor facility is well lighted, heated, and has new indoor bathrooms. In the kitchen we serve both breakfast as well as dinner at our invitational events. Again a lot of time and planning goes in to preparation and planning of the food we serve. Our kitchen and food service is known state wide. When participants come to the Waltonians they can expect quality service.

Thru shooting fees and dues as well as money made in the kitchen we are able to pay our taxes, utilities and associated costs of all events. If we had to pay for the **labor**, utilities, maintenance and upkeep of the grounds the cost would range in the thousands. With 100 members, the current fee for dues would not begin to cover those costs.

Unfortunately in the past few years we have come to a point that only a handful of individuals are absorbing the duties of keeping up the club.

We are asking ALL members to accept an assigned work duty, not just a few. You as a member may be assigned a duty of possibly mowing, cleaning, planning or possibly running an event. This is a private organization and if you wish to be a member, you are expected to SHARE in the workload. As a member you have an equal share in the grounds and facilities. If we continue to have only a few sharing the load, we may be forced to change some of our policies.

We are a family organization and have a strong youth program. Again because of a small group of people who are dedicated to the teaching and sharing of their coaching skills, this program is very successful.

Our leadership has been at the helm for an extended period of time. Most have been there to help for many years. It is time that as a club member you consider sharing some of your skills in the form of leadership. We need individuals to step up and share in planning, preparing and share your knowledge with the club. Only with a team effort can we continue to be a leader in the field of archery. Please contact any member who is involved in the role of a planner, board member, officer, or someone who you see always helping if you believe you can assist. No special knowledge is needed, just someone with ideas to make a project work smoother or better.

Remember with the power of many workers the load is spread out. Consider what we have as a Waltonian and what it would cost if you were to join an organization where the help is not volunteer.
